Genisis School-gen Super Teacher competition: Our deputy principal, Mrs Lori Mravicich, has been nominated for the Genisis School-gen Super Teacher competition with a chance to win a trip to the 2020 Space Exploration Educators Conference in Houston, Texas in February next year. Many of you will know the contribution Mrs Mravicich has made toward the development of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) in our school. Over the last two years, our computer suite has been completely transformed into a "STEAM Room" with 3D printer, robots, green screen, TV, science trolley, providing all possible resources needed to explore science, technology and engineering. Our children participate in the Franklin Science Fair, the Vector ePro8 Challenge and the RoboCup Theatre Challenge. As well as that, Mrs Mravicich is our lead teacher in Mathematics.
