Our school consultation regarding the decapitation of Year 7&8 at our school in order to establish St Ignatius of Loyola Catholic College in 2023 was mixed. Although we didn't ask the question, the feedback was that most families welcomed the establishment of a Catholic college in our area. We received 68 responses (29%) from our 233 families. Of those 40 (59%) wanted our Y7&8 to close in 2023, while 28 (41%) wanted to still have the choice to stay. This information has been passed onto the Auckland Diocese Catholic Education Office and the Ministry of Education. A variety of questions were asked by you and the Board has asked the CEO to respond to them. Last night we were very pleased to meet some of our new families who are beginning at St Joseph's in the new year. I told them St Joseph's is a friendly school and I know you will join with us to welcome them.
