Principal's Message

This week we celebrate Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori. This year's theme is 'Kia Kaha te Reo Māori' meaning 'Let's make the Māori language strong'. On Monday at 12 pm, our school joined with more than 1 million people NZ wide to speak te reo by singing Mo Maria as a school. It was lovely to hear the singing coming from all over the school. Even the construction workers stopped to listen.

This term is quickly drawing to a close. As we finish our third term we realise that we have not had one full 10 week term this year. This has been a crazy year and our children have missed out on sports and school trips. Despite this, they seem to have managed the Covid disruption very well and are very settled back at school. Teachers are now contacting parents about their child's progress so far this year. With one term to go we want all our learners to be fully engaged in their learning. If you would like to request an appointment, please directly message or email your child's teacher to make arrangements before the end of the term.

Meanwhile, around us our new building is rising. It was great that the building could progress during Alert Level 3 and now that it is becoming a reality, the excitement is beginning to grow also. During our Teacher Only Day, teachers were able to suggest furniture layouts and anticipate how they might work together in those spaces. It was a very valuable exercise. We understand it will be ready for us to move into at the beginning of next year, so hopefully it will be in time for the school year to start. Decisions about who will be in the building will be made according to the number of children in different year groups.

Your child may have come home last week to tell you about our lockdown. Last Thursday, from approx 11am - 1pm, our school went into a semi lockdown situation as requested by police. We were not in any danger however the police asked that we keep our children inside while they managed an incident off Childs Ave. Our children were very interested and watching activities from the fence line during morning tea. The school responded to the lockdown bell as expected, and we were able to use the procedure as a practice drill as required for Health & Safety.

Well I certainly am looking forward to our term break and hope you are too. Hopefully we will all be able to travel to catch up with family and friends.

	<p>Due to Covid -19 Key dates will be updated as changes become known.</p>	<p>A Little Bit of History...</p> <p>Euphrasie Barbier 1829-1893</p>  <p>Adele Euphrasie Barbier was born in Normandy, France, on the 4th January 1829. At the age of 14, she started work in a laundry, but she always wanted to be a missionary. When she was 19 she joined the Sisters of Calvary, and was sent to London. But she still wanted to become a missionary in foreign lands.</p> <p>She decided to help the Marist Fathers with their work in the South Pacific, and so on the 15th August 1861, the Feast of Assumption, she founded a new congregation of The Sisters of Our Lady of the Missions (RNDM). Euphrasie Barbier's religious name was "Mother Mary of the Heart of Jesus".</p> <p>In 1864 Euphrasie sent four of her Sisters from France to New Zealand to help teach the growing number of settler children. Some of her Sisters began the first Catholic school here in Pukekohe in 1885, and later started St Joseph's School for younger pupils in 1923.</p> <p>Euphrasie visited New Zealand twice, although she always suffered terrible seasickness on her journeys, and spent some time in Pukekohe, where she planted the oak tree that is seen in Notre Dame Ct today.</p> <p>St Joseph's School's charism is based on our founding order: the Mission Sisters. The Sisters taught in our school for many years.</p>
