Principal's Message

Welcome back to Term 4 and Alert Level 1.

Week 1 Term 4

We are really hopeful we can have a settled 10 week term back to near normal. While this is good news, COVID-19 will be with us for many months to come. New cases in our communities remain a possibility so it is important we avoid complacency and remain vigilant. We ask that you continue to check in when you come into the school. QR code posters will continue to be displayed at our school entrances.

We do need to request that children are not to arrive at school before 8:00 am in the morning. Too many children are arriving very early, some soon after 7:00 am, and there is no one here to supervise them. You may need to consider before-school childcare options as it is unreasonable to have staff supervise your children that early before school.

Being a fourth term, it is lovely to see the children back in their fresh summer uniforms. Hats are part of this uniform and will be required to be worn by all children on sunny days. We will be a little lenient at first but after Labour Day the "no hat, no play" rule will be enforced.

You will have noticed our new building rising quickly above the fence line. As it takes shape, we are becoming excited about the reality of being able to move into it next year. Of course there is lots to be done before then and for us, as a school, to move out of our oldest classrooms will be challenging. It will be easy to move out but deciding what to keep and what to dispose of will be an exercise.

Road Safety Reminder - Dropping your children off to school.

There is a growing concern about the traffic on Seddon St. Parents who man the morning patrol say it is scary how fast cars go by (should be 40 km) and their reluctance to stop for our road patrollers on the crossing. One of our parents is currently asking the Council what we can do to make this crossing safer. This week a parent said she was nearly run over!

It is also really unsafe and selfish to be parking on the yellow lines or using the school driveway as a drop off. Parking on the yellow lines obscures the view of the patrollers, and backing out of the driveway can be dangerous with parked cars either side. We now have some donated "Slow Down" signs displayed on both Seddon and Dublin Streets.

Summer Uniform: A reminder that children should now be in our summer uniform. For <u>Girls</u> this is our green summer dress. For <u>Boys</u> this is grey school shorts (light weight) and our short sleeved polo shirt (logo on front). Both girls and boys should be wearing either black or brown sandals. The sandal **must have a heel/ankle strap**, and no colour variations are allowed. Roman sandals are an acceptable option. Bottle green brimmed hats are expected to be worn in the summer terms. On very wet days, such as Tuesday of this week, we have no objection to children wearing their **school winter shoes/socks** instead of their sandals. It makes sense.

We understand The Uniform Shoppe has not been able to get the fabric for our girls' dresses on time(another Covid factor) and some smaller sizes might not be available until early November. Until then, these girls can continue to wear their winter uniform with sandals or white socks/black shoes.
