Welcome back to our 2021 school year!

On Tuesday we began our school year with a powhiri to welcome all our new families and staff to St Joseph's Catholic School. We particularly welcome Mrs Robin Burns, our new assistant principal, as well as our new teachers: Mr Elroy Muller, Mrs Sophie Hartnett, Mrs Kelly McArthur and Mrs Tiana Farrell (who hold a job share position), Miss Nicole Sarginson, and Mrs Karen McCulloch (Reading Recovery). We also welcome back Mrs Gallagher-Pile from maternity leave. For those of you who may not know, Mrs Kerri Eglemeer's baby girl arrived safely on January 2nd.

What a lovely feeling to have the children back at school - they bring the school to life. So much has changed in our school grounds since the end of last year. Our new building has lost its scaffolding and is standing proudly near completion, the oldest classrooms have been demolished and seeing the space that has been created, we can now envision the large play area that we have gained. We are very pleased with the result and are looking forward to moving in next week.

On Monday 25th January, representatives from our local hapuu, Ngati Tamaoho, accompanied by Fr Robert, lifted the tapu and blessed our new building for the cultural safety of our school community. We were delighted to find that some of our guests had attended St Joseph's in the 1950s and 1960s, and had fond memories of the Sisters and being taught here. The occasion concluded with kai and whanaungatanga in our school hall. Special thanks to Mrs Nikki Tarapa, Mrs Fleur de Farias, and our Board members who helped me coordinate this event.

This year was declared to be a "Year of St Joseph" by Pope Francis in acknowledgement of the workers that go unnoticed, but sustain our life by their work and presence; as seen during the Covid pandemic. St Joseph was a great example of this and it is no wonder that the Mission Sisters chose St Joseph as patron of many of their primary schools, as a protector in a fatherly role. So we were especially delighted to find out that Bishop Michael is available to officially open our new classroom block on the 19th March, St Joseph's Feast Day. How appropriate! 'Meet the Team' Evening

Mark your calendars; on Tuesday 16th February (week 3) we will have an open evening for parents to come meet your children's kaitiaki/teachers and hear about how the learning programme will run for them this year. Presentations by each team will happen throughout the evening with all classrooms open from 6-8pm. Te Roopu Aroha (Yr 0-3) will present at 6pm in the bottom floor of the new building, Te Roopu Ako (Yr 4-6) will present at 6:40pm on the top floor of the new building and Te Roopu Arahi (Yr 7&8) will present at 7:15pm in their learning space. We hope to see you all there.

The School Gate - No children should be arriving at school before 8:00 am in the mornings.

Teachers are not at school to supervise your child before 8:00am. Children should arrive by 8:30 am, giving them time to put their things away and greet their friends, ready to begin lessons at 8:45 am. Coming after 8:45 am means children may miss their class morning prayer; a special way to start the day for their class community.

STEAMClub: Starting in Week 2, Wednesday the 10th of February, we will be offering a STEAMclub after school every Wednesday from 3:00 to 4:00pm which will be held in our Steamroom upstairs in the main building (formerly Rm's 1 &2). This year these sessions will include hands-on activities in Robotics, Spheros, Science experiments, Engineering and Technology projects and are offered to students from Years 3-8. We have limited spaces so it is a first come/first serve basis each term. To help offset the costs of the extra supplies and equipment needed, there will be a \$20 fee for each student for the term. Congratulations to Arizona Leger who is a semi finalist in the 2021 Young New Zealander of the Year Award. Arizona is a past pupil of our school and was our School Captain in 2008. She went on to become Head Girl of her High School and was a Junior Journalist for TVNZ. Arizona is an amazing young woman and I'm sure we will hear more about her successes in the future.

"With a Māori—Pākehā mother and a Samoan—Tongan—Fijian father, Arizona Leger is a proud daughter of Oceania and sees herself as working to represent and advance our Indigenous and Oceanian peoples. Currently, a student of the Masters of Human Rights programme with a focus on Indigenous Rights, especially the rights of Young Indigenous Women, at Auckland University of Technology, Arizona has dedicated her studies, spare time and seemingly endless energy to work towards a fair, just and thriving Aotearoa. In 2018, Arizona was appointed to the Ministerial Advisory Group to review the National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) programme and in 2019 she was selected from thousands of applicants around the world to attend the G(irls)20 Summit in Tokyo as the sole Indigenous Delegate, a newly appointed role. In 2020 Arizona was selected as a northern representative for Kau Tulī, the youth steering group for New Zealand's Ministry for Pacific Peoples, and she is also a trustee and board member of Inspiring Stories and a member of Auckland Council's youth advisory panel. She hopes ultimately to create an NGO that focuses on empowering marginalized communities to exercise their rights and ensuring that Indigenous and underrepresented voices have a permanent seat at the decision-making tables."
