A school is only as good as the people in it and I want to acknowledge our staff, teachers, teacher aides and support staff. Each of you is essential to the success of our school and I thank you for your passion and dedication to the education and success of our youngsters. Our staff has prepared well for the beginning of our school year. We had a lot of changes of classrooms spreading us out over the school campus and so our staff have been busy setting up their new spaces to be welcoming and attractive for our tamariki today. They also

participated in a professional development day earlier this week and I thank them for their commitment to our school.

This year our school newsletters will come out in Weeks 3, 6 and 9 each term but there may be supplementary notices (like this one) from time to time. Please download the Skool Loop app so you get notifications promptly. Next week you will receive the term newsletters from your child's roopu which should give you most of the information you will need to know for now. The term's key dates will also be sent to you. We do try to keep our website up to date but we are working through some changes on it at the moment.

Next Monday 5th February, school is open for learning but closed on Tuesday 6th February for Waitangi Day. Every year we need to be open for the required number of days set by the MOE. This affects which days we stay open. In Term 1 we have eleven school weeks but four of them are shortened by observed holidays. This year, Easter being during the term has made a real difference. The upside is that the April holidays will be two full weeks without Easter. The downside is the school year will finish closer to Christmas.

I wish to encourage you to drop your children off at school by 8:30 am. **Our school day begins at 8:45 am** and the children must be already in class to begin their day with their roopu in prayer; this is an essential part of our life as a Catholic school. **The school day finishes at 2:45 pm** and children must be collected by 3:00 pm.

This year our 2024 Cultural Focus is Kaitiatanga / Stewardship and this term our learning inquiry focus is Hospitality / Manaakitanga. "When I was a stranger, you welcomed me." (Mt.25:35) Jesus Christ teaches that whenever we welcome one of the least of our sisters and brothers, we welcome Christ himself. So to our students returning to school. Nau mai hoki mai. Welcome back. And to our new students, a special and heartfelt welcome to our school family! We are excited to get to know every one of you and know you will feel valued here. Nau mai ki te kainga. Welcome home!
